In conjunction with the Richard III Society of NSW, we will discuss the background to the Wars of the Roses (1455-1487), where young Edward, Duke of York, emerged victorious to take the crown from his cousin Richard II, to the Battle of Bosworth (1487), where Richard III was defeated and the Tudors under Henry VII rose to power

rapidly. Come and meet the real Richard, as told by those who loved and respected him and learn the ways in which, and the reasons why, his story and his legacy became so subverted in the 16th century.
